



Thank you to everyone who recently donated to the school mission project. In August, we took a large amount of supplies to the middle school for distribution to the students.



## First Christian Church of Bowling Green, OH ~ Board Meeting, November 14, 2024

The November 14, 2024, board meeting of First Christian Church was held at the church and via Zoom. Present: Pastor Gene Sugg, Mike Solley, presiding, and members, Nancy Andrade, Sharon Daniels, Jay Kirkbride, Pat Koehler, Ruth Maltby, Steve Riewaldt, Char Scherer, Kim Thomas, Rae Thomson and Elizabeth Wick.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Moderator Mike Solley, who opened with prayer. The devotion was given by Sharon Daniels who read a devotion entitled Don't Forget Thanksgiving from a book entitled Thankful Heart. Be thankful for God's gifts Pat will offer the December devotion.

### **Administration:**

**Approval:** The October 10 board minutes were approved on a motion by Kim Thomas, second by Rae Thomson. **Clerk:** Sharon and Lee Field-Starks will prepare an updated membership list.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Mike read the report prepared by Jim Adams. November contributions were weaker than the past few months at \$6,700. Expenses were higher due to the asphalt maintenance of \$6,300. The Men's group provided \$3,150 to assist in offsetting the expense. For the month we had a deficit of \$3,500, however, year-to-date we are still positive by over \$23,000....

The CD at Huntington Bank matured and the finance committee invested that total of \$82,379 into a new CD for 5 months at 3.75%.... The budget for 2025 has been prepared and need to call a Congregational meeting in December to approve. The proposed budget is in the board material.... It is recommended that the boiler project be approved and that the Property budget line item for Maintenance be increased by \$8,000 to \$20,000. Suggest 50% of the funding comes from the operating fund and 50% comes out of the designated capital fund (\$22,139 balance). The report was accepted into the minutes.

<u>Property:</u> Steve Riewaldt reported that a bid of \$3,500 was the lowest of three bids for stripping, cleaning and applying four coats of wax to Fellowship Hall, two area bathrooms, the kitchen and back hall. The project will be done in January and they suggest having it buffed twice a year.... In January the committee will receive bids for a new natural gas contract. They will also be signing a new contract for snow removal and salting.... A custodian has been hired and will do a deep cleaning of the church at a charge of \$400.

<u>Technology:</u> Jay Kirkbride reported that Blue Tooth is being considered to enhance the audio connection to the hearing devices in the church. They are also looking at using a joy stick to improve the camera movement.

**Personnel:** No report

<u>Pastor:</u> Gene plans to visit Sharon Bronsink and Marge George this weekend... BGSU students Lily and Cameron are getting more involved in the church and it may be possible to encourage other students to attend... He would like to have an Advent Bible Study and is considering the potential of a Sunday meeting after worship with a lunch prior...The Pastoral Care Committee will be organized after the first of the year....Gene has a PET scan scheduled followed up by a Doctor's visit next week as a hopefully final end to his cancer treatments.

#### **Old Business:**

FCC Constitution and Bylaws: The Constitution is going through final corrections and will be presented to the congregation in January or February.

**<u>Strategic Planning:</u>** Moderator, Mike Solley will be forming committee.

<u>New Business:</u> Pastor Gene confirmed December 17 as the date for a Concert with Nano Beraia and Malik Halce. Kim Thomas and Mike Solley volunteered to provide transportation for them.

### **Ministries:**

Worship: Mike Solley will continue as worship leader.

<u>Care Elders:</u> Elizabeth reported that they met Oct.22. Sharon Bronsink is in Wood Haven and Diane Morlock will have a hip replacement on Dec 4. Other people needing prayers will be listed in the prayer concerns listed below.

#### Missions:

**Hospitality:** No report. Mike noted that the group will be organizing the potluck on November 24

Men's Group: Steve Riewaldt reiterated that the group will pay half of the asphalt resurfacing in the amount of \$3,150 as per the treasurer's report.... They will be giving three \$250 Walmart gift cards for Christmas families, an increase from previous two gifts. In addition they will be donating \$200 each to the following charities: Salvation Army, Cherry Street Mission, Cocoon, BG Christian Food Pantry and the Cleveland Christian Home.

Women's Group: No report. Rae noted the group will be meeting Wed, Nov. 20 at the church at 1:30.

FCC Community Meal: A thanksgiving meal was served to 134 people. The Kilpatrick's will plan and oversee the December meal.

#### **BG Christian Food Pantry:** No Report

**BG Schools Mission Project:** Elizabeth reported that they are still collecting items.

<u>Transportation:</u> Kim Thomas and Mike Solley have offered to transport Nano and Malik for the concert. Sharon Daniels offered to be available to drive for area trips.

Green Team/Green Chalice: No report.

### **Christian Education:**

<u>Women's Spiritual Study Group</u>: The group will not meet on November 27. They will finish the Just Women book on Dec 11 and resume with a new book in January.

<u>Prayer Concerns:</u> Sharon Bronsink, Sharon Shaffer, Marge George, the Beekers, the Riewaldt's, Sharon Daniels, Marie Rogers and Jim Corbitt, Nancy Andrade, Marge Leathem.

The closing prayer was given by Pastor Gene.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:45.
